RESEARCH PROFILE

My research interests are mainly focused on the investigation of biological correlates for clinical risk factors in childhood that may predispose for the development of later in life psychopathology. I have conducted studies using animal models of ADHD to study stimulant effects of behavior, also measured cortisol reactivity in aggressive children to study physiological response to emotional stimuli and have used both structural and functional magnetic resonance imaging to study anatomical and physiological characteristics of children with ADHD. My additional research interests include studies that investigate the mechanisms of stimulants (e.g. methylphenidate) in relation to improving task performance but also potential for misuse as well as purported effects on brain morphology as result of treatment. These studies have informed my future interests related to understanding and developing strategies for cognitive remediation in individuals with cognitive deficits related to traumatic brain injury (TBI) that may include a great variety of special populations(i.e. war veterans, athletic injuries, consequences of various accidental traumas). Most recently I have collaborated with the IMAGEN, ENIGMA and ABCD

consortia to investigate mechanisms of development of psychopathology in adolescence and the effect of pharmacological treatments on brain structures. With recently obtained research funding from NIDA I will also continue to utilize functional neuroimaging and computational modelling to probe for possible sensitization effects of stimulants in drug naïve children with high clinical risk for later substance use disorders characterized by impaired motivation and behavioral control. My future goals include using the data from the current R21 grants to prepare a successful submission for a R01 application to investigate possible imaging markers of sensitization in young children at risk for SUD. I have also submitted a R01 application to use data from the ABCD study to investigate the contribution of family history and childhood adversity on the activation and connectivity of the brain reward system.

CLINICAL PROFILE

Through my training and clinical practice I acquired a great deal of expertise in the treatment of childhood disruptive behavior disorders, including ADHD, but also childhood trauma, developmental disabilities and adolescent and adult substance use disorders. In that capacity I have treated a great number of patients through the outpatient and inpatient facilities in Mount Sinai but also as a consultant from Mount Sinai to various agencies and clinics in Manhattan, the Bronx and Staten Island. These included the Adolescent Health Center, the Children's Aid Society, the Manhattan Center for Children (former Children Advocacy Center), Counseling in Schools and the West End Day School programs. I have also supervised a number of residents who provided clinical care in all of these facilities. In 2012 I was recruited to be the medical director of a newly developed clinical program at the James J. Peters VA Medical Center that specializes in the care to OEF/OIF veterans and their families. This program is unique in its approach of providing comprehensive assessment of veterans' clinical needs and offering intense and high personalized treatments that aim for a timely symptom remediation and support through the process of reintegration to civilian life. Since January of 2015 I accepted a position as Medical Director of the Comprehensive Adolescent Rehabilitation and Education Services at the Division of Child Psychiatry at Mount Sinai where I am currently involved providing clinical care as well as leadership in research and program, development. Since September 2018 I am also Medical Director on a SAMSHA funded grant entitled "Enhancing Adolescent Treatment and Recovery Services at Mount Sinai St. Luke's" that has developed the Teen and Family Recovery Services (FuTuReS) program, a comprehensive clinical program for adolescents with comorbid substance use and trauma related disorders. At present my clinical activities are mainly dedicated to providing services to adolescents enrolled in these two clinical programs as well as providing supervision for residents as well as clinical care in the child and adolescent psychiatry outpatient clinic.

IMPACT

As an attending and clinical consultant from Mount Sinai I have delivered services in multiple clinical settings and the quality of this work has been acknowledged by letters of appreciation from outside entities to my mentors and superiors. I have served on many local and national committees responsible for the organization of symposia and other professional events. As president of the New York Council on Child and Adolescent Psychiatry I have overseen all of the activities of the organization on local and national level from 2012 to 2014. I have supervised over 50 residents in general and child and adolescent psychiatry who went to pursue successful careers in academic and clinical medicine. In my research work I took part in studies of novel treatments for ADHD and schizophrenia. I have been invited to present at many national and international forums in psychiatry including the meetings of the American Psychiatric Association, American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, the Society for Neuroscience, the Society of Biological Psychiatry and the American College of Neuropsychopharmacology. I have published as first author and co-author on a number of

original and review papers in most of the high impact journal in psychiatry and neuroscience including the American Journal of Psychiatry, JAMA Psychiatry, Biological Psychiatry and Neuropsychopharmacology among others.
